### FUEL IMPORT INFRASTRUCTURES LICENSED

By means of Resolution No. 21/2017, of 10 May 2017, the Government of Timor-Leste approved the exceptional and temporary licensing of the Port facilities of Cement Timor Trading SA and Lai-Ara Unipessoal, Limitada, to carry out the activities of importation and storage of fuel, for a 1-year period, commencing 25 April 2017.

### COMMERCIAL

#### NEW COMPANIES' LAW

The new Companies' Law was published by means of Law No. 10/2017, of 17 May 2017, which expressly revokes the prior framework approved by Law No. 4/2004, of 21 April 2004.

The amendments introduced by the new Law include: (i) creation of a new mandatory corporate body, the Legal Representative; (ii) removal of the minimum share capital for limited liability companies by quotas; (iii) abolishment of bearer shares; (iv) the possibility of conducing meetings of the corporate bodies through means of distance communication; (v) a simplified regime for shareholder loan agreements; (vi) rules for affiliated companies; and (vii) abolishment of General Partnership and Limited Partnership Companies.

The new Law will become effective on 17 September 2017.

## NEW COMMERCIAL REGISTRY LEGAL FRAMEWORK

The new commercial registry legal framework was approved by means of Decree-Law No. 16/2017, of 17 May 2017.

The commercial registry is aimed at publicizing the legal status of individual entrepreneurs, commercial

The registration of acts subject to commercial registration is made with the Registration and Business Verification Service (SERVE), at the request of the interested parties.

The new Law will come into force on 17 September 2017.

# TAX AND CUSTOMS

# ORGANIZATIONAL FRAMEWORK OF THE TAX AUTHORITY APPROVED

The Government of Timor-Leste approved the organizational Framework of the Tax Authority, through Decree-Law No. 13/2017, of 5 April 2017. The Tax Authority is responsible for, inter alia, (i) collecting taxes; (ii) preventing and fighting tax evasion and fraud; (iii) developing and managing data systems; and (iv) informing taxpayers and economic operators, including through the issuance of binding opinions on compliance with tax obligations.

NEW CUSTOMS CODE

By means of Decree-Law No. 14/2017, of 5 April 2017, the Government of Timor-Leste approved a new Customs Code, which entered into force on 4 June 2017.

The National Parliament of Timor-Leste approved the territorial planning legal framework, by means of Law No. 6/2017, of 19 April 2017.

LEGAL FRAMEWORK ON TERRITORIAL PLANNING APPROVED

In addition to general provisions on the scope and purpose of this Law, the new statute contains rules on the legal status of soil (e.g. spaces and infrastructures for public use and State public domain) and on the

territorial planning system (e.g. national plans, municipal plans, coordination and cooperation principles,

territorial planning instruments, publicity, amendments, revision and suspension of territorial planning instruments, and interim measures). EXPROPRIATION FOR PUBLIC INTEREST

By means of Law No. 8/2017, of 26 April 2017, the expropriation legal framework was approved.

This statute defines expropriation as any legally admissible restriction to private property or related rights or interests, irrespective of the persons or entities to which they belong, and clarifies that is only admissible in cases of "public interest" (utilidade pública).

Public interest covers inter alia national defense and security, public pathways, roads, tunnels, railroads, and ancillary facilities; public transportation systems; ports, airports and terminals; etc.

The new statute also details the expropriation procedure, clarifying the purpose of and rules applicable to
